He worked directly with the Performing Choir for more than 15 years as my assistant until 2009, when he accepted the position as Artistic Director of the Seattle Girls Choir. Throughout this entire time Jacob has maintained his role as Staff Instructor with Vocalpoint, and has been a key player in this ensemble's continued success. He is an excellent musician and a top-tier educator. His wealth of knowledge and deep connections to the Northwest Choirs make him the perfect person to take over the musical helm of this wonderful organization.

Words cannot adequately express my gratitude to all of the people who have given so much to the Northwest Boychoir and Vocalpoint during my tenure. I want to express my deepest thanks to Maria Johnson, who works tirelessly on behalf of this organization. She has been a true friend and a valued colleague.
